DEADLINE: Friday, February 26, 2016

Applicants should submit all of the application materials (application form, personal statement, resume, transcripts, and one letter of recommendation) as word documents or PDF to the following email address: fellows@woodruffcenter.org.

1. APPLICATION FORM

2. PERSONAL STATEMENT

Please limit the personal statement to no more than 700 words (two typed pages, double-spaced). The personal statement should include information on:

- What interests you about the Mellon Undergraduate Curatorial Fellowship Program and the Summer Academy? The program, which is supported by the Mellon Foundation, aims to expand the diversity of curatorial ranks in American art museums. Do you think this is important? Please explain.
- Describe why you consider yourself to be a student representing diversity in terms of culture, background, or experience, and why you feel committed to representing diverse perspectives. How do questions of diversity shape your academic interests?
- Explain, drawing on your extracurricular activities, areas of study, background or other experiences, how you can contribute to the Mellon Foundation's initiative?
- Provide an example of an experience where you were able to offer a diverse perspective to a project, discussion or dialogue and explain the impact you had.

3. RESUME

Please be sure to include relevant employment and volunteer experiences, and computer and language skills.

4. TRANSCRIPTS

Please provide unofficial transcripts for your entire undergraduate career, including the college or university you currently attend and any you may have previously attended.

5. ONE LETTER OF ACADEMIC RECOMMENDATION

Applicants must have one confidential letter of academic recommendation from a faculty member at your college or university. Please be sure to provide the name and contact information (email and telephone number) of your recommender on the application form.

The letter of recommendation must be submitted to our email address (fellows@woodruffcenter.org) by the application deadline. The recommendation should clearly indicate the applicant's full name in the subject of the email. Please advise your recommender to submit their letter as a word document or PDF.
